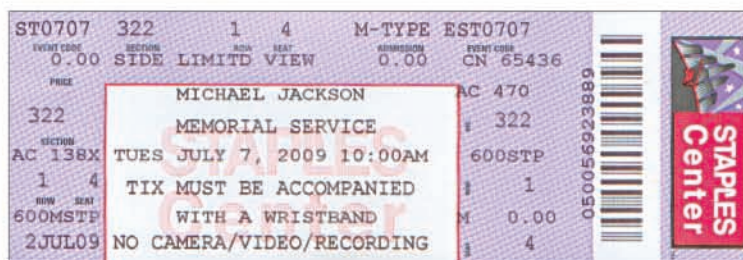


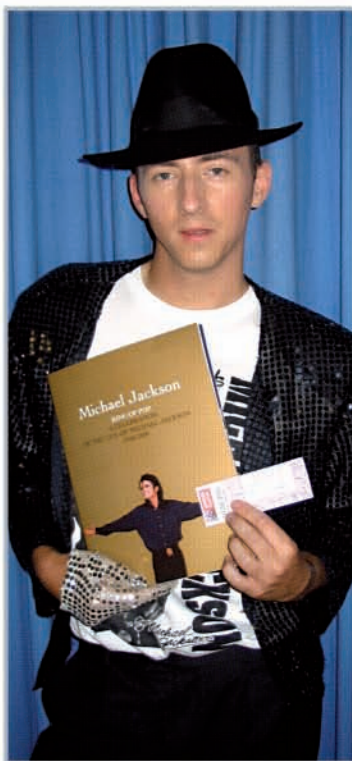
# THE FINAL
